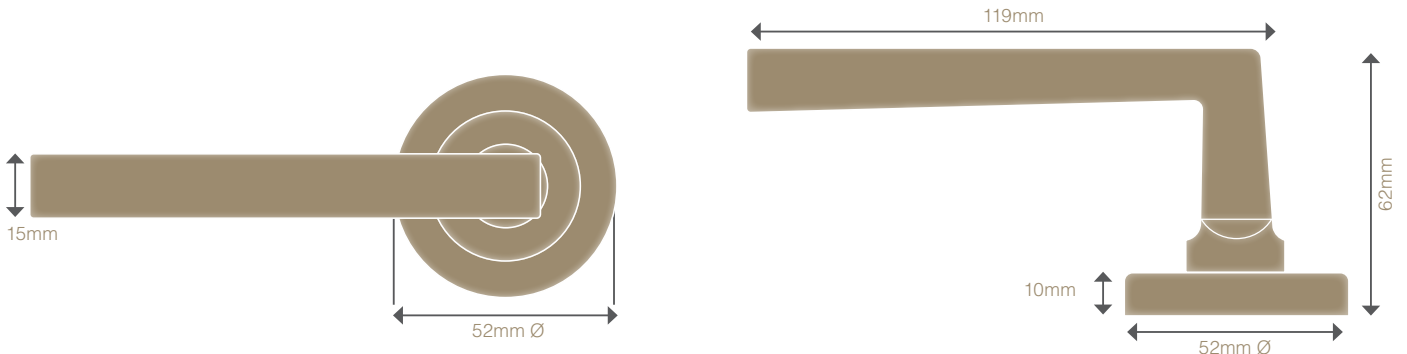

\* Available with standard or magnetic latches. To upgrade any passage or separate privacy (auxiliary) set to magnetic latches simply add an 'M' to the end of the existing 4 digit code.

## Specs

- > Constructed from solid brass
- > Suits door thicknesses of 30–50mm
- > For door thicknesses that exceed this, custom spindles and alternative fixings will need to be sourced
- > Suitable for interior and exterior use (advise application on order)
- > For external applications we recommend selecting a living finish that will age gracefully over time instead of a lacquered finish that may tarnish if it gets badly scratched or damaged.

## Installation

- > 57mm backset (see diagram) or 60mm backset for magnetic latches
- > 42mm screw centres — Thru fixing supplied
- > Passage Set installation shown
- > Inside hole can be 22–25mm diameter
- > Through screw holes can be drilled at 3 & 9 o'clock **OR** 12 & 6 o'clock positions.

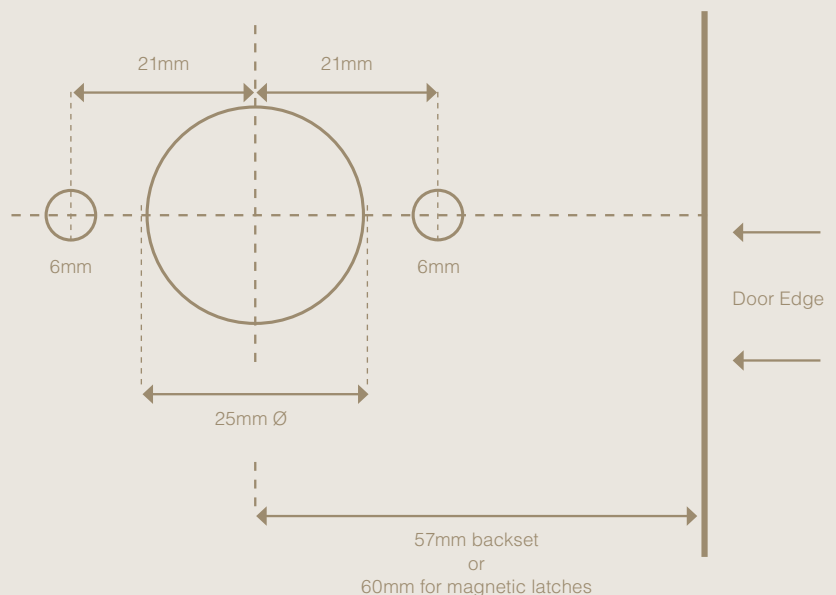

## Care & Maintenance

### Stocked Finishes

To protect your handles we suggest cleaning the surface of your hardware periodically with a warm soapy lightly dampened cloth to remove any build-up of dust and grime that may cause corrosion and affect the integrity of the finish. Then simply dry thoroughly with a clean, soft cloth. Minimum of monthly cleaning of door handles is recommended for both finish preservation and general hygiene.

Atmospheric conditions, salt deposits, acids, caustic agents, cement or dust on construction sites all have the potential to cause discolouration to the surface.

Please avoid using any metal polishes, abrasive cleaners, scorers or rough cloths that may damage or scratch the hardware and do not spray or immerse the hardware in liquid to clean.

### Living Finishes

The living finishes will naturally patina over time with general use. As with all living and aging finishes, it is recommended to clean the surface periodically with a damp soapy cloth to remove any build up of dust and grime that may cause corrosion and affect the integrity of the finish.

Unlacquered Brass can be further protected by using the Windsor wax polish occasionally, rubbing this lightly over the surface will provide a layer of protection for extended finish longevity.

Oil Rubbed Bronze, Roman Brass and Dark Roman Brass can be preserved by gently applying a thin oil layer to the surface from time to time. Wipe a thin layer of olive oil (or similar) over the handle then with a clean cloth wipe again to remove any excess on the surface.

### Lacquered Finishes

The finishes with a lacquer are recommended to be kept free of dust and grime to prevent any chance of these particles affecting the integrity of the lacquer and potentially causing breakdown or discolouration. We suggest these are wiped and cleaned periodically using a mild window cleaner and damp cloth.

Gloss Lacquered finishes may get some light surface scratches appearing with normal wear and tear, for this we recommend using the Windsor wax polish occasionally, rubbing this lightly over the affected area to will provide a layer of protection for extended finish longevity.

We do not recommend Lacquered Finishes to be used externally as if badly scratched or damaged tarnishing can occur.
